St. Therese of Lisieux, the Little Flower of the Child Jesus



Today, 1st October, is the Feast Day of Therese of Lisieux. Therese is most known for her "Little Way" and her example of faith and service to God is relevant to us today. She spoke not of doing great things, but of small things with great love. She saw herself as a child who lived in complete dependence on God. Therese acknowledged her littleness and believed this showed more clearly God's greatness. She once said, "If all the lowly flowers wished to be roses, nature would lose its springtime beauty." Therese saw herself as a tiny flower in the garden of God and believed His power shone more clearly through her weakness. Her message of simplicity and childlike trust in God, our merciful father is timeless and lives on in many hearts as a spirit of courage and hope. Free Online Safety Guide What parents need to know about Pokémon GO How often do you see someone not paying attention to where they're walking because they're engrossed in their phone? Those distractions might just last for a matter of seconds – but Pokémon GO is a game which actually relies on players focusing on their screen for long periods while they're out and about – with all the glaring physical hazards that entails. Pokémon GO was rightly heralded as a game-changing release thanks to its pioneering use of augmented reality on mobile phones (in fact it was the first ever title to utilise that feature on Android devices). As today's #WakeUpWednesday guide explains, however, an increased likelihood of injury isn't the only safety concern around the game. Read on to access your free guide ...



Pokémon GO was released in July 2016, and had amassed more than 100 million downloads by the end of that month. The following year, an academic study by an American university reported that people playing Pokémon GO in areas near traffic had been a named factor in 31 injuries and two fatalities in the US alone.

That's not to say that the game itself is dangerous – just that eager young Pokémon trainers may regularly need reminding about the importance of staying aware of their surroundings. That's just one of the safety tips in our #WakeUpWednesday guide to Pokémon GO, which also touches on the visibility of young players' locations and possibility of contact from strangers.

Risk Assessment and Contingency Planning for any Covid-19 outbreak – where we are now? Have a lovely weekend and see you all Monday, at 8.45am

Unfortunately, Covid-19 has not gone away and we must all continue to work together to protect our children and ourselves as much as possible to reduce the risk of this in our school family. Please visit the school's website to view the current Risk Assessment and the Contingency Plan for any outbreaks of Covid-19. Face coverings/masks are not required to be worn by adults on the

playground, however, if you feel safer and more secure wearing one, then please do so.

Equally, the rules on social distancing have also relaxed but please be respectful of others and observe the personal space of those around you. There are no longer any staggered starts/finish times for classes – all pupils need to arrive at 8.45am to start at 8.55am and all pupils finish at 3.15pm every day.

It is essential that those pupils who have tested positive or are showing symptoms of Covid-19 DO NOT come into school. Parents must organise a PCR test for their son/daughter with: a high temperature – this means they feel hot to touch on their chest or back a new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual) a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Only when a pupil has tested positive, themselves, must they self-isolate for 10 days. If a member of their household tests positive they do not need to self-isolate unless they start to show symptoms of Covid-19 (and then the parent must arrange a PCR Test for them asap). When a child is absent because they have Covid-19, teachers will provide remote learning for them, via Class Dojo.
