Advent starts this weekend. Fr. Michael came to school today to bless the class advent wreaths that have been made by the pupils.

Advent comes from the Latin word 'adventus', meaning 'the coming'. The first candle,

which is purple, symbolises hope. It is sometimes called the "Prophecy Candle" in remembrance of the prophets, especially Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ. At this time of year, the church gathers to celebrate light coming into the world. Christ came to give hope that life could be different, He came to give us life in abundance, freedom from the chains of the law, freedom from slavery to fear and control. He came to bring light into the darkness. The Lord of light and the bringer of hope. Advent wreaths are circular, representing God's infinite love, and are usually made of evergreen leaves, which "represent the hope of eternal life brought by Jesus Christ." The hope of Christ is through His gift of everlasting life, and in the life, we see Him bringing in the every day. Remembering the truth of the nativity and listening to God's Word in our world, can help bring hope to a hopeless world. Let us be filled with hope, as we start this holy season, of Advent.
