Dear Parents and Carers,

Re: planned incinerator project 544 Duncombe Road

Bradford Council refused to approve this permit application and The End Journey Ltd have appealed this decision by submitting an appeal to the Secretary of State. This project would mean that harmful toxins would be burned into the air that we all breathe for 12-14 hours 5 days a week. This will negatively impact on the health and wellbeing of our young children, staff, parents and local community. For example:

- nitrogen dioxide (NO2);
- sulphur dioxide (SO2);
- total dust, which includes fine airborne particulate matter (PM10 and PM2.5);
- carbon monoxide (CO);
- hydrogen chloride (HCl);

- hydrogen fluoride (HF);
- Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs);
- the following trace metals:
- cadmium (Cd);
- thallium (TI);
- mercury (Hg);
- antimony (Sb);
- arsenic (As);
- lead (Pb);
- chromium (Cr);
- copper (Cu);
- manganese (Mn);
- nickel (Ni); and
- vanadium (V).

I strongly object to this appeal process because of the short timescale, all objections must be placed by 10th January 2022 and over the Christmas holidays which is not sufficient time for the process of appeal.

I have emailed Naz Shah, MP for Bradford West asking for her support. We need to all act together for a safe environment for our children and our school family.
