The Feast of the Epiphany


Loving Father,

Fortnite Chapter 3

Fortnite is one of those rare titles which breaks through from the gaming world to create a wider cultural impact. This success was swifty monetised, or course, leading 1 forfulde action figures, plash hys, tended clothing, stationery, bedspreads and the like. The nature of these products hints at a steelable proportion of the game's fairs being below the recommended age limit of 12.

So how much or a danger does Fortnite pose to its younger players? For starters, the game is fundamentally about using an array of weapony to eliminate a stream of enemies. As our WaterLipWedneckey guide outlines, braieves on screen violence is far from the highest concern—with potential issues over in ago purchasing, scarns and toxic behaviour from other players.

COVID - 19

The Risk Assessment has been updated and is available for you to view on the school website. We must all continue to work together to ensure we keep our selves safe and that the school can remain open - we do not want to have to close to school to classes!

As a result, only one adult on the school playground at any one time and I recommend adults wear a face covering as they bring and collect their child(ren), as it is not always possible to maintain safe distances at the

bottom gate. Any adult coming into the school must wear a face covering to see any member of staff.

If you suspect you have Covid-19 or your child is showing symptoms you need to arrange a PCR Test as soon as possible and self-isolate until you receive the result. If a child tests positive they must self-isolate for 7 days and on days 6 and 7 have a Lateral Flow Test (2 negative results mean they can attend school from day 8). If they do not have a Lateral Flow Test on days 6 & 7, then they must self-isolate for 10 days and return from day 11.

Confirmatory PCR tests following a positive lateral flow device (LFD) test result are to be temporarily suspended from Tuesday 11 January. This will mean that anyone who receives a positive LFD result will be required to self-isolate immediately and will not be required to take a confirmatory PCR test.

Adults and children aged between 5 & 18 years of age that have close contact with someone who tests positive must take Lateral Flow Test for 7 consecutive days and if they get negative results every day and DO NOT show symptoms of Covid-19 they can attend school.

Remote Learning will be provided via Class Dojo for those pupils who cannot attend school because they have tested positive for Coronavirus. Please contact school staff if you have any issues, as we want all our pupils, to be able to access the same learning that their peers are having in class. This will support your child's progress and development.

I thank you for your continued support with implementing our safety measures and checking your child is completing the learning that is on Class Dojo.
