Spiritual reflection

'The Lord's Spirit has been given to me. He has sent me to give the Good News to the poor, declare freedom for prisoners, to give new sight to the blind, to set all the downtrodden free'. (Luke's Gospel 4:14-21)

This weekend's Gospel gives the account of the beginning of Jesus' ministry, in his home place, Nazareth. During the service in the synagogue, Jesus reads the text from the prophet Isaiah, about the messiah anointed to bring the good news of liberation to captives. No doubt, it's not the first time that the people hear about that; yet, this time there's just something new going on. It's no more a promise which people should wait for its achievement. Jesus simply says: "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." The liberation that the people have been waiting for is there – Jesus is the living Son of God. As a community of believers, we need to ask the same question: "How is God's Spirit prodding, nudging, leading us, as a family of God, where we become, more and more, faithful to the job description in Isaiah, and to the Gospel of Jesus.

Loving Father, watch over us, the children gathered before you in prayer, and strengthen us to share the gift of your love with the world.


Oak Class

As part of the 'Under the Sea' topic in Oak Class, they have been exploring different sea creatures and watching the Sea Monkey eggs hatch.




Beech Class

Most commercially released titles have an age certificate high enough to alert parents to the possible dangers, but download-only titles don't require a rating and therefore often push the boundaries even further.

COVID - 19

The Risk Assessment has been updated and is available for you to view on the school website. We must all continue to work together to ensure we keep our selves safe and that the school can remain open - we do not want to have to close to school to classes!

As a result, only one adult on the school playground at any one time and I recommend adults wear a face covering as they bring and collect their child(ren), as it is not always possible to maintain safe distances at the bottom gate. Any adult coming into the school must wear a face covering to see any member of staff.

If you suspect you have Covid-19 or your child is showing symptoms you need to do a Lateral Flow Test as soon as possible and self-isolate. If a child tests positive they must self-isolate for 5 days and on days 5 and 6 have a Lateral Flow Test (2 negative results mean they can attend school from day 6). If they do not have a Lateral Flow Test on days 5 & 6, then they must self-isolate for 10 days and return from day 11. Adults and children aged between 5 & 18 years of age that have close contact with someone who tests positive must take Lateral Flow Test for 7 consecutive days and if they get negative results every day and DO NOT show symptoms of Covid-19 they can attend school.

Remote Learning will be provided via Class Dojo for those pupils who cannot attend school because they have tested positive for Coronavirus. Please contact school staff if you have any issues, as we want all our pupils, to be able to access the same learning that their peers are having in class. This will support your child's progress and development. It is a statutory requirement for schools to provide remote learning and it is in your child's best interests that they are encouraged, by parent(s) to complete this. I thank you for your continued support with implementing our safety measures and seeing your child completes the learning that is on Class Dojo.

Winter Weather & School Closure

We have a text messaging system in school as well as Class Dojo which we use to contact you with any important messages. This will include any school closures due to bad weather conditions. You can also hear the school closures on Pulse Radio or by visiting Bradford Schools Online (emergency school closures). Always assume we are open unless you receive a text or class dojo message saying the school is closed.

Warning: No Holidays in Term Time

Please book holidays for when school is closed. We do not authorise any holidays in term time and fines will be issued for taking your child/children out of school during term time. Please be mindful of the travel restrictions in place and the need to self-isolate after visiting certain countries.
