1st Sunday of Lent 'You must not put the Lord your God to the test' Lk 4:7



Every day we have to make choices. Sometimes it is easy to make the right choice, but other times we find ourselves being tempted to do what we might later regret. Lent is a good time to take a look at our lives and like a good gardener to 'remove weeds' that strangle new growth and spoil the plants & flowers; and

so, allowing us to clear out all the things that come between us and God's love, for example selfishness, greed, jealousy, dishonesty etc. In Luke's Gospel (4:1-13) the Holy Spirit leads Jesus into the desert to prepare for His mission to reveal God's love to the world. Jesus wanted to focus all His energy and attention to God's will for the world, to draw strength from His love and to spend time alone with His Heavenly Father. The devil wanted to disturb Jesus' peace & Satan, tried to make Jesus use His power for selfish reasons and to put God's love to the test. Strengthened by the Holy Spirit, Jesus was faithful and obedient to His Father and used the words of Scripture to convince the devil to go away and leave Him. This teaches us that Jesus is very close to us when we suffer temptation and He has suffered the same feelings of uncertainty and doubt, yet God's Spirit is ready to give us strength when we need to overcome weakness.

A huge thank you to Dom from Living Streets for coming to our launch assembly Monday. We are feeling very inspired and ready to have an active journey to school!






Here is a pupil in Ash Class tracking their travel to school every day! They are all enjoying working to achieve the weekly award! Take the opportunity to walk

Indeed, some aspects of WhatsApp which are designed to be helpful or increase privacy – such as disappearing messages and live location services – actually exacerbate the risks.
