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HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE BOARD

4th Sunday of Lent

In this week's Gospel, we read Luke's account of Jesus' parable of the Prodigal Son.



The younger son asks for his share of his father's wealth without any further thought of his father or brother and wastes the money to enjoy himself. Having spent his money foolishly, it wasn't long before he had nothing. He found himself far from home, in a country where there was a famine and no-one who cared for him. Realising what a huge mistake he has made, he decided to return home and ask for his father's forgiveness; 'I will leave this place and go to my father and say: Father I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as one of your paid servants'. (LK 15:18-20). His father had been watching and hoping for his return. He was so pleased that his beloved son had come home that he was ready to forgive him. The older son had remained loyal to his father and worked hard to please him. He had not behaved selfishly or wasted his father's hard-earned fortune; he was jealous and angry to see what fuss his father made of his irresponsible and self-centred younger brother. His father reassured the older son of his love but insisted on celebrating his wayward, younger son's return and change of heart.

This parable reminds us that whatever mistakes we make, however selfish and self-centred we might be, God will always welcome us back to His love. Our expression of regret and desire to return and be close to God's love give Him cause for great celebration. Let us use this Lent, as a time to say sorry to God, for the times we have not followed God's will and to turn back to God's warm, loving welcome.

Let us pray:

Loving Father, in your patient love, hear the prayers of your children.

Make us grow in love for you and for one another. Amen.

Food Waste

In school we monitor the eating habits of the children very closely and I am very grateful for the support and help that Emma and the kitchen staff provide during our lunchtimes. We never expect children to eat things they do not like but like any good parent, we encourage them to try new foods and make sure that they eat enough to help them have the energy to concentrate in the afternoon and to play outside. The teachers share the menu each day to the children and then when they go into the dining hall, at lunchtime, they choose what they want from the serving area, where all the food is open and ready to be served to them. Emma, has to ensure that children on school dinners select enough food that is classed as a portion and provides a meal that is nutritious. We are aware that children will try to eat very little and waste food that they have hardly tasted or insist they will not eat. To avoid this, we have been speaking to the children and I ask all of you to speak to your child about the menu choices they are making. We regularly review the menu and Emma tries to ensure that the children's favourites are included. Mr Clayton spoke to the School Council about this matter as well this week and they all requested that they would like pizza and chicken nuggets – we have explained that these options cannot be included every day!! We want to help our children have a healthy relationship with food and a good understanding of a healthy diet and not waste food, when so many people are hungry in our city as well as throughout the world. Help us, by talking to your children about their school lunches, thank you.




Ash Class - completed a number bond pair up challenge – well done!
