HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE BOARD

5th Sunday of Lent



In Sunday's Gospel, we read how the Pharisees brought an adulterous woman to Christ. They thought that Christ would condemn her immediately. They thought He would give them permission to go ahead and stone the woman to death. However, they were wrong because Christ came to save and not to condemn. They were wrong because the ways and thoughts of Christ are different from theirs. So, instead of condemning her, Jesus restored her life and offered her a new chance to live. He simply told her: "Go and sin no more."

Like this woman, Jesus is always giving us new opportunities despite our weaknesses. He knows how vulnerable we are to sin. He knows the forces we contend with in our life. His mission is to save us from all our sins and accusations. It is not to condemn us. Hence, Christ says, "I have come that they may have life and have it in full" (Jn 10, 10).

Therefore, we should be encouraged by these words of Jesus, "Neither do I condemn you." The complete mercy and forgiveness of Christ is incredible. When He says these words to us, He means them. He means that He has taken care of our negative past. So, Christ will always fill us with joy, which He will complete for us soon through His death and resurrection.

Let us pray:

Loving Father, Fill us with compassion and love And make us people of mercy, According to Your commandment of love. Amen.

Food Waste

In school we monitor the eating habits of the children very closely and I am very grateful for the support and help that Emma and the kitchen staff provide during our lunchtimes. We never expect children to eat things they do not like but like any good parent, we encourage them to try new foods and make sure that they eat enough to help them have the energy to concentrate in the afternoon and to play outside. The teachers share the menu each day to the children and then when they go into the dining hall, at lunchtime, they choose what they want from the serving area, where all the food is open and ready to be served to them. Emma, has to ensure that children on school dinners select enough food that is classed as a portion and provides a meal that is nutritious. We are aware that children will try to eat very little and waste food that they have hardly tasted or insist they will not eat. To avoid this, we have been speaking to the children and I ask all of you to speak to your child about the menu choices they are making. We regularly review the menu and Emma tries to ensure that the children's favourites are included. Mr Clayton spoke to the School Council about this matter as well this week and they all requested that they would like pizza and chicken nuggets – we have explained that these options cannot be included every day!! We want to help our children have a healthy relationship with food and a good understanding of a healthy diet and not waste food, when so many people are hungry in our city as well as throughout the world. Help us, by talking to your children about their school lunches, thank you.


