HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE BOARD

Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves (LK 10:1-12, 17-20).

This Sunday's Gospel begins immediately after the final verse in last Sunday's Gospel. After strong language about the difficulties of **discipleship**, Jesus immediately appoints 72 people to go ahead of him to every town and place he plans to visit, proclaiming that the Kingdom of God is at hand. Jesus admits it will be difficult, that he is sending them out like lambs among wolves. Yet they are to bring nothing with them, not even a money bag or sandals. They are to greet no one on the way so as not to be distracted from their mission. Jesus may have sent them out as lambs among wolves, but at the conclusion of this passage he assures them that they have been given power over the enemy and nothing will harm them, not even serpents and scorpions. Sharing in the mission of Jesus is difficult, but everyone is called to do it, not just the religious. Just as the first disciples won followers for Christ by their words of peace and kind and loving actions, we too can do the same today in our everyday lives.

Help us to hear and understand your Word, So that we may joyfully proclaim and share its message with the world.














Lime Class
